Speaker of this session was Miss. SUMAIYYA KAZI (software engineer at TCS). She has an experience of Home Gardening for 5 years. The session marked 66 attendees, which included students from DLLE, students from VSIT and the faculty of VSIT.



The session started with the explanation how we can create home gardens in these times of apartments and flat system houses. Few suggestions about the issue were given by the speaker. Balconies of the flats can be created in a small garden. Plants can be hung on the grill of the balcony, thus saving some space for more plants. Also indoor plants create a beautiful décor for the home. Many interior designers use plants as a side piece for the appealing look of a room.

Miss. SUMAIYA KAZI explained us very well about home gardening; she showed us some plants one of which was the spider plant also known as airplane plant. Spider plants are perennial plants and have an indefinite lifespan, many of these plants end up outliving their owners. With good care, they can easily live for 50+ years and they often become family heirlooms thanks to their longevity.

One of the student Karan Mamania also gave inputs from his side about plants. He explained about snake plant which is newly bought a year ago, he also has mangrove plants planted in his home garden, and also about how some plants died due to some diseases, etc.

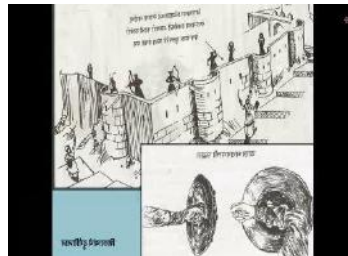

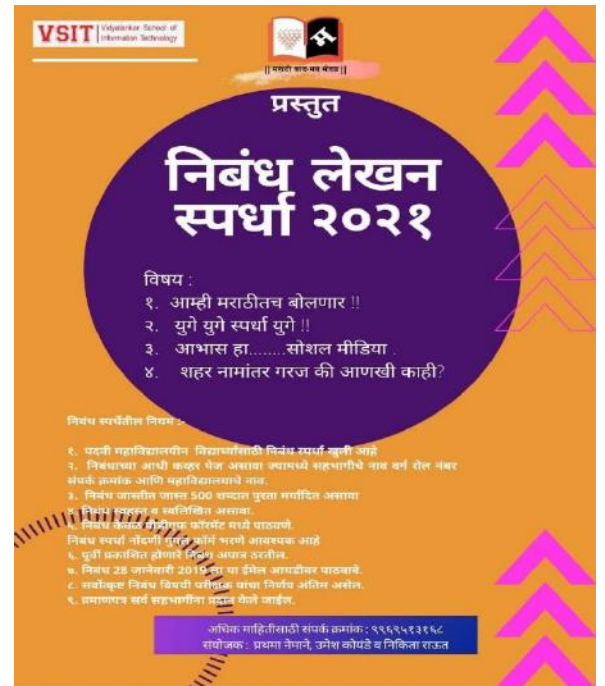


Marathi Bhasha Sanvardhan Pandharvada

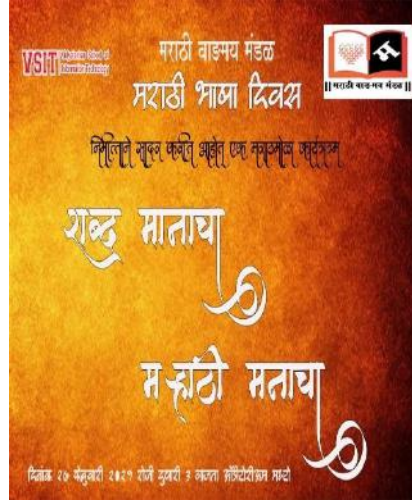
