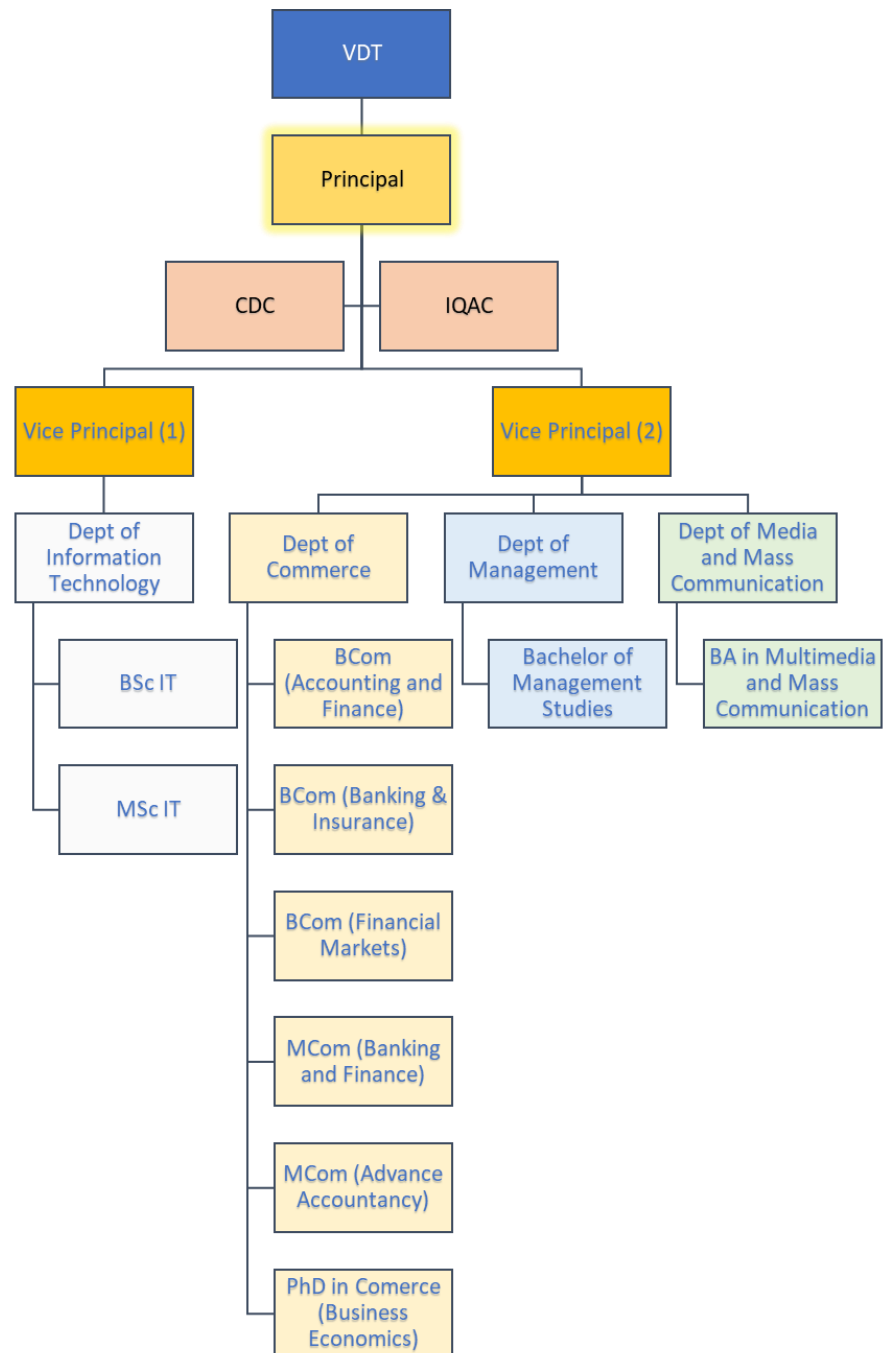

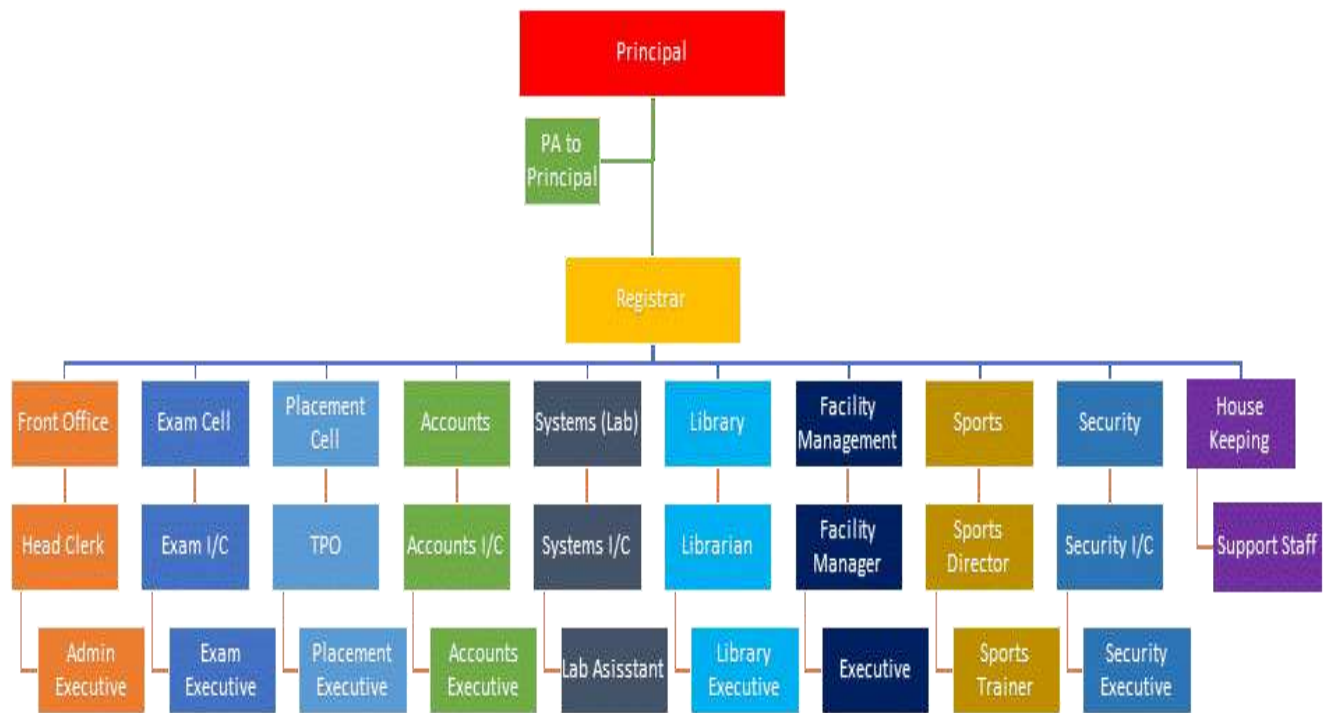


# ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE:

## ✓ VCMT - 2019: Two-day Multi-Disciplinary International Conference- Policy Initiatives of Government of India- Appraisal and Assessment

### Day:1 (8<sup>th</sup> February 2019)

Vidyalankar organized its sixth annual international conference, VCMT 2019 on February 08 and 09, 2019. The two-day conference brought, under one roof, research scholars, academicians, subject experts and eminent personalities. The objective of the conference is to provide a common forum to disseminate the knowledge of academic excellence.

The first day of the multi-disciplinary conference observed a number of participants arriving in the college premises. The Principal, Dr. Rohini Kelkar rendered the welcome address for VCMT. Dr. Rohini Kelkar spoke of the importance of understanding the changing socio-economic scenario of India and the impact on various sectors in the country. She also introduced the keynote speaker, Dr. Ashima Goyal and the Guest of Honour, Mr. Niranjana Rajadhyaksha to the participants.

Mr. Niranjana Rajadhyaksha is Research Director and Senior Fellow at IDFC Institute. Previously, he was Executive Editor of Mint, a financial daily, where he managed the opinion section, wrote the daily editorials and the award-winning Café Economics column. Niranjana is a member of the academic advisory board of the Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics and the board of trustees of the Centre for Civil Society. He was also a member of the advisory committee on the fifth volume of the official history of the Reserve Bank of India, written by Tirthankar Roy.

The keynote speaker, Dr. Ashima Goyal provided a comprehensive insight into the structural reforms in the economic policies of India. She analyzed the historical development of economic policies through the years and identified the areas of improvement in the economy vis-à-vis policy implementation. The Guest of Honour, Mr. Niranjana Rajadhyaksha spoke on the points elaborated upon by the keynote speaker and in addition, closely looked at the future prospects of the changing socioeconomic scenario. ## ✓ Faculty Development Programme on Nuances of Research Methodology & Data Analysis using SPSS and Excel

### DAY 1 (April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2019)

FDP was inaugurated on 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2019 by Dr. Rohini Kelkar, Principal, Vidyalankar School of Information Technology along with Dr. Amit, Head, VIT, Dr. D.M. Marathe and Dr. Jyotsna Golhar, Resource Persons. On this occasion, Dr. Rohini Kelkar has welcomed both the resource persons. In her speech, she highlighted the importance and objectives of organizing this faculty development programs. As conceptual understanding of the various research methods, tools and techniques is an essential prerequisite to conduct empirical research in different areas like commerce, management, science, technology etc. She also mentioned that this is the sole responsibility of the teachers, who transmits their theoretical and practical knowledge to their academic circles and students. So, it is essential to develop an academician that is capable of early identifying the thrust areas of research.

### Technical Session:



The resource person of this session, Dr. Jyotsna Golhar, Associate Professor, VIT, has started the session. She equipped the participants with the objective, importance and various sources of literature collection by using the internet. She also discussed about the various methods of literature review. Dr. Jyotsna covered the Research Fundamentals like Introduction to Research Methodology, Identification of Research Problem, Formulating Research Objectives, Research Design, and Literature review. It was a refresher for the all the faculty members.

Dr. Marathe, introduced methodical aspects like, Scale Construction; Reliability & Validity measure; Sampling Fundamentals; Questionnaire Designing. He also introduced SPSS. He shared his views on concepts like what is research, its objective, type, process, sample size decisions, data collection methods and hypothesis formulation etc. Further, he emphasized on how to formulate a testify hypothesis which is the soul of the successful

Dr. Jyotsna emphasized on the various methods of primary data collection like interview, schedule, questionnaire method, survey and observation methods. She also shared her views on how to prepare the questionnaire and how to make questionnaire in SPSS by taking one example of a dataset of toothpaste's quality. She explained various data analysis functions like mean, frequency distribution and standard deviation, on this dataset.

Dr. Marathe covered Correlation & Regression Analysis; T-test, Chi-Square Test with data and examples available from the real world. He also gave homework for faculties to prepare one questionnaire for their own research topic.

## **Strategic Intent**

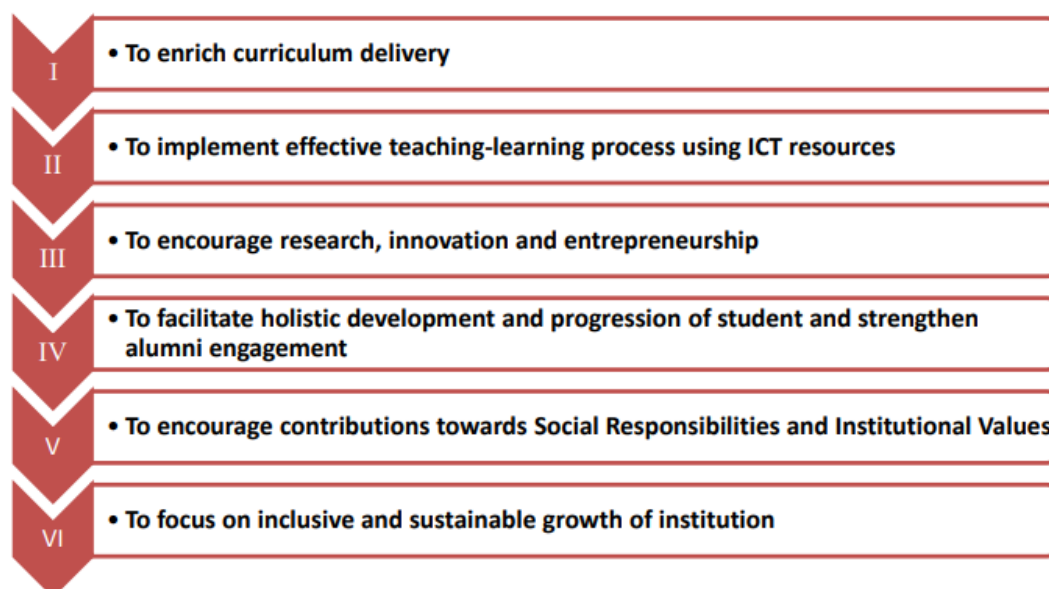

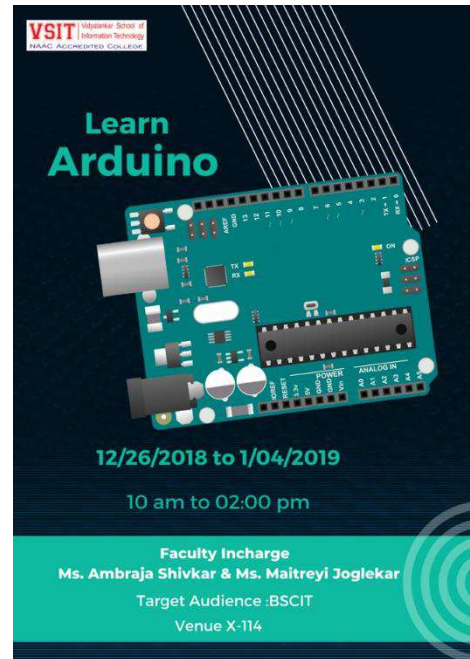

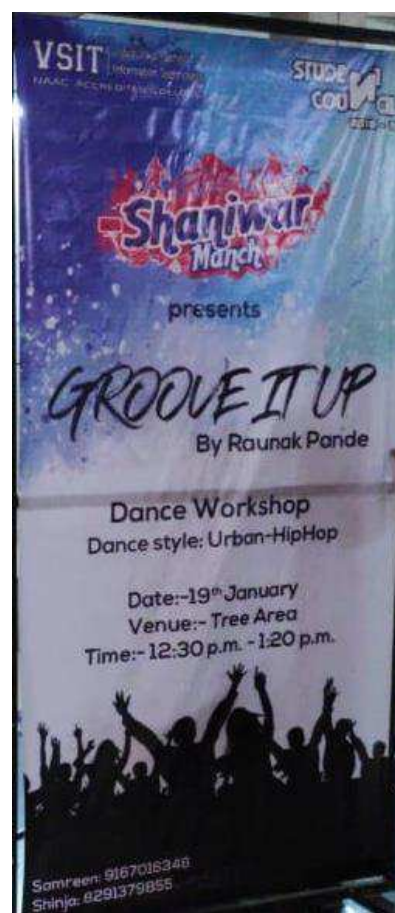
# CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

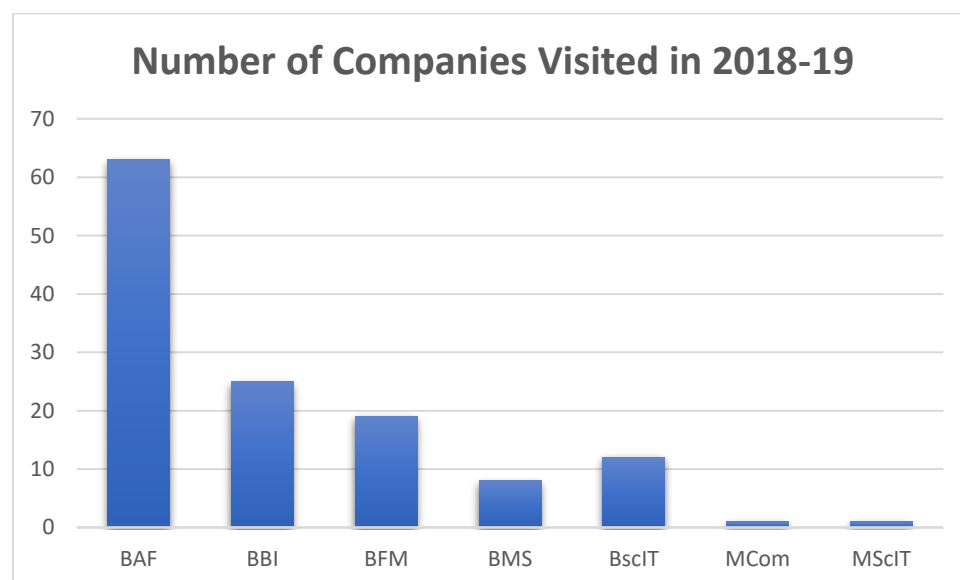

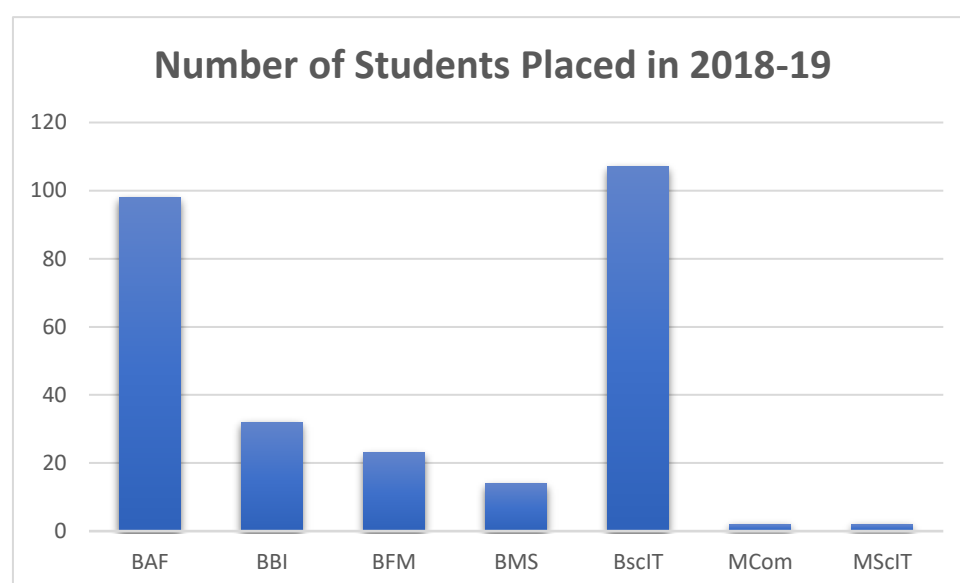

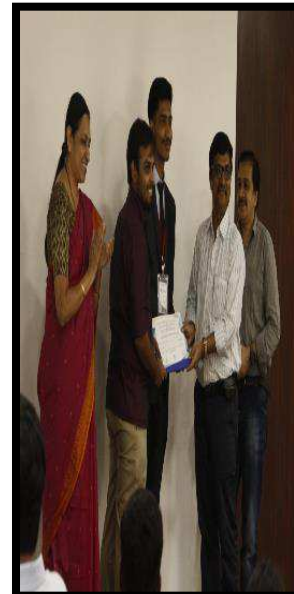
