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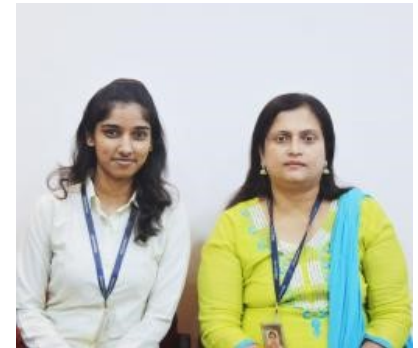
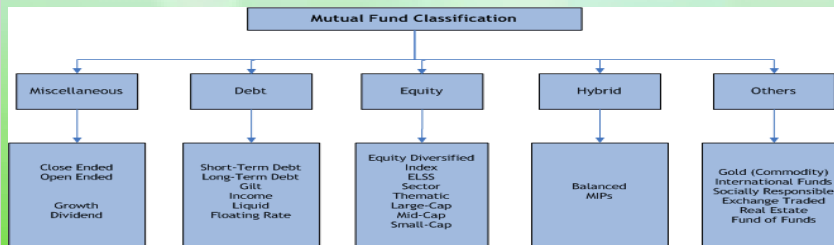
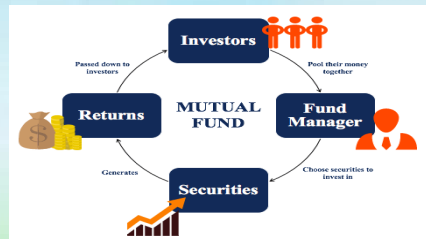
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Perception And Awareness Of Customers Towards Investment In Mutual Fund(finance)

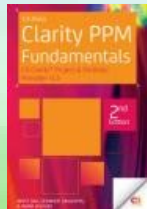


Figure 1: Desirable features of GSTN

1. INTRODUCTION

This paper provides a review of the literature on the development impact of migration and remittances on origin countries. Migration happens for some certain reasons it can be your tourism, an advance education, career enhancement, political conditions, for health personnel, due to economic development of our country, etc. . . . You need a culture that supports a knowledge transfer. People are so obsessed for their career that they are leaving their home country for the sake of highly paid job. The term "**brain drain**" was coined by the British Royal Society in the early '60s, in order to describe the migration of skilled workforce - more precisely the departure of British scientists and technicians to the U.S. and Canada. In many cases, our home country is not getting bad advantage of sending their talented and skilled work force to the developed country. When a person is earning for himself it can be contributed to the GDP of the country where he is devoting his work and time. People feel secure in developed countries because all the citizens must pay taxes to the government so that they get a pension at a time of old age. Through some health personnel people match up with a standard of living which is not within their country. In India, 67% people likely to migrate and settle their permanently.
